

### A Message from Dennis Johns

It was about a year ago that I began to have issues with my health. There was no discernable pain anywhere on my body other than a constant dull headache and just plain feeling bad. I continued with my duties at work and home in effort to push through and attempt to be productive. I continued with much of the pace of our social adventures even attending "Monster Jam," an Astro's post-season game, a golf scramble, performed weddings and funerals, as well as other outings with family and friends. If you are wondering, Monster Jam was really cool. I even went to the ER on one occasion thinking that maybe I was having some sort of heart issue but was released with the encouragement that everything in that area was just fine. I did not feel fine at all.

I had gone to the doctor previously for a number of visits before the experience in the ER without any true diagnosis. In fact, the first visit was on September 13 of 2018, and it produced a prescription for allergies while I continued to feel bad. It was on the seventh appointment (tests, ER, follow up) that it was discovered that there was a mass located on my colon with the possibility of Diverticulitis. It was truly interesting to observe how painstakingly difficult it was for the Doctor to share with us the news of the mass after conferring with two other physicians. A hospital stay (colonoscopy) was scheduled to expedite my diagnosis and to address the removal of the mass. I was relieved at least to know that we now had something to point to as the culprit of my sluggish demeanor.

The surgery was successful in the discovery of Diverticulitis. But there was no mass to be removed; it was not there. I realize that there are many views or explanations of how this mass could have been mistakenly diagnosed or misrepresented in the tests that were performed. The fact remains that there was no mass present at the time of the procedure. I am not one who is easily amused at these types of situations. In fact, I would be one to look for ways to say that it was perhaps never there.

God is at work all around us all of the time, and we are so busy or perhaps too proud to allow our thoughts to give credit and honor to God for His acts of healing or love or provision. Paul writes in I Thessalonians 5:16-18 "16 Rejoice always, 17 pray continually, 18 give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus." I believe Paul is giving us a blueprint for our lives as he stresses being "all in." We will be producers of joy as we center our thoughts continually on Him, giving us ample opportunity to be grateful for all things that come our way. We live the life of putting a little bit of God on when we need Him and forget to acknowledge Him in the mundane or ordinary. Sometimes we even try and explain His power and presence away as circumstantial just as one might do in the disappearance of a mass.

Let's be all in. God desires all of us - not just a Sunday every now and then. Rejoice, pray, and give thanks!
