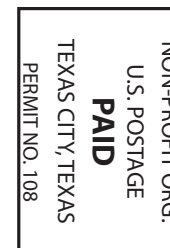

A Message from Dennis Johns

As I look back over the years, I can say that I have been very fortunate to have witnessed advances in medicine, technology, and culture and have been the benefactor of others who have gone before me to make my life experience more comfortable and enjoyable. For those individuals, I am grateful. When I think about the comforts and freedoms that we enjoy I am mindful of others in a different spectrum who sacrificed "normalcy" to engage in the endeavor of ensuring that comfort and freedom could be a reality. My father saw battle in the Pacific front in WWII and was on Iwo Jima when the famous flag was raised. He returned home to raise a family and serve his community through ministry and education. That seems pretty normal to me.

Outside of a few memorable stories, he never talked much about his military duty, but I do remember he detested firecrackers. As a kid, I was intrigued by firecrackers and fireworks. As an adult I really love a great firework exhibit (sometimes in the middle of a parking lot). As I've advanced in age and wisdom (wink wink) I've realized that perhaps his distaste of firecrackers was a result of what he had experienced, and memories the pop and flash brought to his mind things of which I had no understanding at all. War had changed his perception of what was normal. I will not pretend to understand any of the physiological aspects that come along with hand-to-hand combat or being deployed to another country for the purpose of military service, but I know that there is tremendous sacrifice of what we consider "normal."

As we approach Veteran's Day, I am more mindful than ever of the sacrifice that has been made and want to say a sincere THANK YOU to all who have served our country whether through combat, or deployment, or preparation for conflict. I know that your normal has changed. In Matthew 11:28-29 Jesus encourages us to find our normal in following Him; 28 "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. 29 Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. 30 For my yoke is easy and my burden is light."
