Heart to Heart...

THE JUST SHALL LIVE BY FAITH

500 years ago, last Tuesday, Martin Luther nailed his 95 theses to the Wittenburg door, and thus began the Protestant Reformation. The church in Martin Luther's day emphasized salvation by works. The Pope back then was having the bishops and priests promote the purchasing of indulgences (paying money for salvation). Luther desired to live a holy life but found it impossible to do on his own. One day he was studying the Book of Romans, and when he read Romans 1:17, "the just shall live by faith" he realized that salvation was something given to him by grace rather than earned. It set him free, and Martin Luther challenged the Papacy for not teaching the Bible. He was ex-communicated from the church, and a whole new movement started.

I found it interesting that a few years ago a study group of Catholic and Protestant Bible scholars examined the teachings of Luther. The Catholic scholars concluded that Luther was right, and in modern Catholicism, he, the Papacy, and Čatholic scholars would agree. Pope Francis, endorsed these findings as well and declared, "we are one again!" Other doctrinal beliefs separate us as Baptists, but it is good to hear we agree on salvation by grace through faith. My roots are Baptist, and though my Baptist history professors point out that though we are not technically protestant, it would not be a stretch to conclude that we were greatly influenced by the Reformation. My problem is that though we proclaim to live "by grace through faith" it appears that we allow a works theology to creep into our beliefs. To live under grace through faith is the only way to enjoy and grow as a child of God. To live under the law will lead us into heresy, judgmentalism, and a miserable life. I challenge you to live "by faith."
